

## **Jordi Tejel Gorgas**

Ph.D. in Contemporary History (Fribourg University) and Sociology (EHESS, Paris)

A native of Barcelona, between 1994 and 2004 he completed his MA degree in International Studies (CIDOB, Barcelona) and Ph.D. degree in Contemporary History at Fribourg University and in Sociology at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales (Paris). He then held fellowships at the School of Oriental and African Studies (London, 2006-07) and the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales (Paris, 2007-08). Between 2005 and 2009 he has been teaching contemporary history of the Middle East at Fribourg and Neuchâtel universities.

Over the past 14 years he has published widely both on Kurdish history as well as on different aspects of the Middle East. His most recent books include *Syria's Kurds. History, Politics and Society* (Routledge, 2009); *Le mouvement kurde de Turquie en exil. Continuités et discontinuités du nationalisme kurde sous le mandat français en Syrie et au Liban (1925-1946)* (Peter Lang, 2007); and *Irak, chronique d'un chaos annoncé* (Lavauzelle, 2006). He has also published articles in such journals as *A contrario*, *Etudes rurales*, *European Journal of Turkish Studies*, *International Journal of Kurdish Studies*, *Middle Eastern Studies*, and *Revue des mondes musulmans et de la Méditerranée*.
