This meeting aims to raise awareness, stimulate debate and catalyse engagement among global health stakeholders in Sweden on the post-polio transition within the context of the SDGs.

The specific objectives of the meeting are:

- → To explore the impact of the "transitioning of polio assets" in the context of the SDGs, in particular SDG 3, health system strengthening and universal health coverage.
- → To discuss the relevance and national ownership in countries with ODA, particularly in fragile states.
- → To explore the global consequences of the post-polio transition, including the implications for multilateral support and the impact on WHO.
