Freedom of assembly

The right to peacefully gather in public

Freedom of association

The right to form an association, register, hire staff, open a bank
account

Freedom of expression

 The right to express an opinion, investigate, watchdog, advocate for policy change

Participation

The right of local stakeholders to free, prior and informed consent to development plans

Transparency, accountability, non-discrimination

RISE OF AUTHORITARIANISM

Silencing of journalists and whistle-blowers

• In 2019, 250 journalists imprisoned, 150 in China alone

Barriers to NGO registration and funding

- Burdensome legal requirements
- Restrictions on foreign funding: Russia-style "foreign agent" laws now adopted in Israel, India, Australia, Austria, Hungary & Poland

Targeting of certain groups

- Vilification, distrust and violence
- Human rights groups; anti-corruption; refugees and migrants; women's rights; LGBTIQ+ groups; labor rights; environmental rights; youth


