SRIDHAR VENKATAPURAM

Chair, Independent Resource Group for Global Health Justice (IRG-GHJ)



Sridhar Venkatapuram is Chair of the Independent Resource Group for Global Health Justice, a group of mainly political philosophers coming together to help identify the global justice aspect of the COVID-19 pandemic. Sridhar is also Deputy Director of King's Global Health Institute, and Associate Professor of Global Health and Philosophy at King's College London. Sridhar has been an academic-practitioner at the forefront of health ethics and global health for over 25 years. He was a pioneer of the health and human rights movement as the first researcher at Human Rights Watch to examine HIV/AIDS and other health issues, and at the age of 25 he was supported by the Ford Foundation to provide human rights training to the first cohort of Indian HIV/AIDS organisations. He has worked as a consultant for a range of international organisations including the Open Society Institute, the Population Council, and Doctors of the World-USA, the Health Foundation (UK), and World Health Organization. He holds a number of degrees in a range of disciplines including international relations (Brown), public health (Harvard), sociology (Cambridge) and political philosophy (Cambridge).

Sanjay G. Reddy is an Associate Professor of Economics at The New School for Social Research. He is an Affiliated Faculty Member of the Politics Department of the New School for Social Research. He teaches development economics, microeconomics, philosophy and economics, and other subjects. He has published widely in academic journals in economics and related subjects and given many prominent academic lectures. He has held fellowships from the Center for Ethics and the Center for Population and Development Studies at Harvard University, the Center for Human Values at Princeton University, the Justitia Amplificata programme of the Goethe University of Frankfurt and Free University of Berlin, and the Advanced Research Collaborative of the City University of New York.
