He leads efforts to implement the President's holistic vision on universal health care and is responsible for the coordination of all state and private actors, as well as religious health institutions involved in UHC in the DRC. He is also Coordinator of the Presidential Task Force to fight Covid-19 in the DRC.

He is currently a senior advisor on digital health at the IDB and was an advisor to the former Chilean Minister of Health in the sector's digital transformation process and a senior consultant at CORFO-Chile. He participated in the creation of the digital health agendas and their roadmaps for the ministries of health of Paraguay, El Salvador, Peru, and Ecuador.

Ann has authored numerous publications on digital health and innovative approaches and multisector partnerships to address global health challenges.

She was the Director of the Global Health Division at Yale University School of Public Health and responsible for the first major Fulbright Programme on global health.



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
