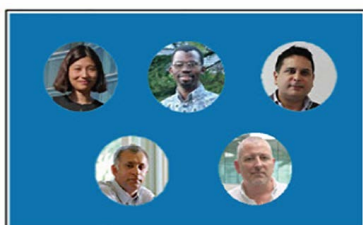

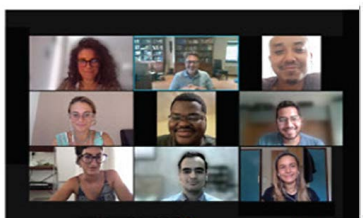
New Faculty members
