


The Institute also offers Dual Master Programmes, joint BA/MA Programmes, Summer Programmes, as well as an Undergraduate Semester Programme.



Our beautiful campus extends from the United Nations' headquarters to the shores of Lake Geneva. Modern buildings such as the Maison de la paix, the Grand Morillon Student Residence, the Edgar and Danièle de Picciotto Student Residence juxtapose historic villas and the headquarters of the World Trade Organization, UNHCR, the ICRC and other leading international organisations. The Institute's newest student residence, Grand Morillon, was designed by world-renowned architect Kengo Kuma, and has added 700 beds to the existing 250-capacity of the Edgar and Danièle de Picciotto Student Residence.
