Reconnaissance des ancien.ne.s

*En 2016, l'Association a créé les Alumni Awards dans quatre catégories : Alumnus/Alumna of the Year, Young Alumnus/Alumna, Commitment to the Institute and Alumni Association et Lifetime Professional Achievement. En 2021, quatre nouveaux Awards ont été lancés, en lien avec les initiatives stratégiques lancées par Marie-Laure Salles, directrice de l'Institut depuis le 1^{er} septembre 2020, à savoir Art & Culture, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Peace, Sustainability.

Dans la perspective du 100^e anniversaire de l'Institut, une deuxième série de **14 portraits** d'alumnae-i a été dévoilée avec les portraits de Nazem al-Koudsi, Marcel Boisard, Hernando de

Soto, Madeleine Z. Doty, Carlos Fuentes, Jean-Pierre Gontard, Leonid Hurwicz, Jakob Kellenberger, Dimitri Kitsikis, Andréa M. Maechler, Hans J. Morgenthau, Fatsah Ouguergouz, Tôn Thât Thiên, Ralph Zacklin.

Jean-Pierre Gontard, Andrea M. Maechler, first Swiss Deputy General Manager of the Bank for International Settlements and first Woman to serve on the Governing Board of the Swiss National Bank, Fatsah Ouguergouz, Judge and Vice-President of the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights, posthumously Madeleine Zabriskie Doty ('45), represented by a WILPF agent, Pacifist, Civil Libertarian, and Advocate for the Rights of Prisoners who acted as International Secretary WILPF, Dimitri Kitsikis ('60), represented by his son, Philosopher, Poet and Professor considered to be one of the Leading Geopolitical Thinkers of the XXth Century, and Nazim al-Koudsi ('29), represented by his sons, Statesman and Visionary and Last Democratically Elected Syrian President (1961), all received the Lifetime Professional Achievement Award. This trophy recognises alumnae-i who have demonstrated excellence and achievement in their distinguished career; have demonstrated leadership in their profession; have made a positive contribution to the prestige, influence and reputation of the Institute; and exercise a strong positive influence within the community. Savannah Dodd ('15), Founder and Director of the Photography Ethics Centre, received the Young Alumna Award.

La communauté compte désormais près de 22'000 membres, 4'800 d'entre eux sont connectés sur LinkedIn. Bourses et prix

The **Alumni Community Scholarship** was established in 2013 to fund the academic and living expenses of a student in financial need for a year. Funds for the scholarship are collected through direct donations on the Alumni Scholarship webpage and also during a raffle and silent auction held at the annual Alumni Reunion, which reunites alumni from around the world each year. This year, the scholarship goes to

Amrutha Somasekharan Nair completed her BA in Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery and a Master's in Health Administration in India. She then worked for around four years at India's grassroots level, focusing on primary healthcare, sexual and reproductive health, and health system strengthening. She is now pursuing a master's degree in International and Development Studies with a specialisation in Global Health at the Institute. Through her work, she aims to improve health outcomes in vulnerable communities and achieve health equity, ensuring that everyone can access healthcare without financial hardship. Ultimately, Amrutha hopes to contribute meaningfully to community-centric global health initiatives.

This exposure has been a transformative experience, and it is the best gift I could have ever received (...) "Defending Democracy in the European Parliament: An Ethnography of Political Parties and Institutional Rules".

Defended in 2022 under the supervision of Gregoire Mallard

Her thesis explores an understudied institution, using ethnography to shed light on its internal workings. Through an interactionist approach, she reveals how a democratic institution focused on the rule of law also provides a platform for the far-right, contributing to the normalization of illiberal ideas.
