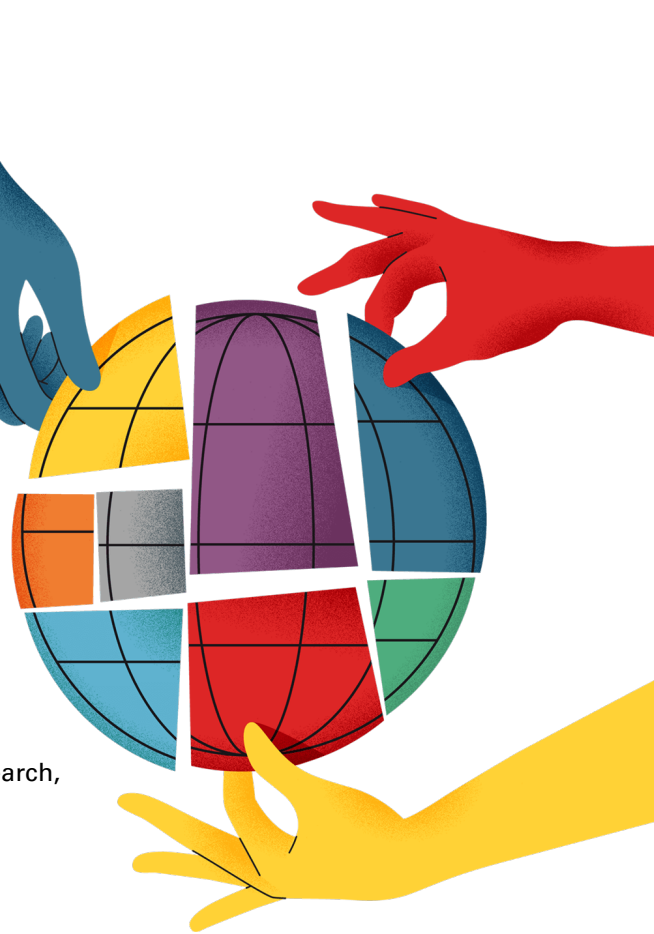


INTERNATIONAL LAW COLLOQUIUM
